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DOJ's Organization

Although Headquartered in Washington, DC, the Department of Justice (DOJ) has offices across the United States

DOJ's Mission/Priorities:

- to sustain national security;
- to investigate and prosecute financial and mortgage fraud;
- to uphold traditional law enforcement, immigration and litigation-related missions;
- federal prisons and detention;
- to assist state, local, and tribal law enforcement;

DOJ's Major Buying Activities

- Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI)
- Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA)
- Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms, and Explosives (ATF)
- The U. S. Marshals Service (USMS)
- The Federal Bureau of Prisons (BOP)
- Federal Prison Industries (FPI)/UNICOR
- The Office of Justice Programs (OJP)
- The Justice Management Division (JMD)

DOJ Small Business Requirements

■ DOJ-SBA Small Business Goals

- Small Business = 30% prime contracting, 40% sub-contracting
- Small Disadvantaged = 5%, WOSB = 5%, SDVOSB = 3%, HUBZone = 3%

■ Small Business Requirement Thresholds

- 1) At or below \$3,500 (micro-purchase level):
 - *Small business set-asides considered, not required*
- 2) \$3,500 - \$150,000 (micro-purchase to simplified acquisition threshold):
 - *Reserved for small businesses. Set-asides considered for 8(a) firms, HUBZone, SDVOSB, or WOSDB/EDWOSB before using a total small business set-aside*
- 3) \$150,000+ (above simplified acquisition threshold)
 - *Small business set-asides must first be considered*

Tips on Doing Business With DOJ

Identifying Requirements

- 1. Register in the System for Award Management (SAM) and keep your profile current.**
- 2. Make sure you select all appropriate business types (veteran-owned, service-disabled veteran owned, self-certified small disadvantaged business, etc.)**
- 3. Make sure your profile includes all of the NAICS codes where your firm could realistically perform.**
