


Since 1998, USPAACC's Asian American and other Diverse-Owned Business Certification has




Fast100 Asian American Businesses Awards 2023

CNPP has been one of the most important and special programs ever launched for both the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) and USPAACC.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, when so many small businesses needed assistance, Congress passed the American Rescue Plan Act of 2021, which authorized \$100 million in CNPP grants to underserved or unserved small business owners. USPAACC was 1 of 8 national Tier 1 award recipients to help Pan Asian American small businesses in multi-Asian languages in 5 major states hardest hit by the pandemic and anti-Asian sentiments, to adjust, re-establish, learn new skills, and grow again.

USPAACC has strongly advocated for continued funding for CNPP through 2024, sharing success stories about the Asian American small businesses that the CNPP has helped. By December 2023, our CNPP has assisted more than 2,200 unique clients with over \$51 million in access to capital requests and secured over \$3.5 million in capital approvals for the undeserved small businesses.

BUSINESS EXPRESS: ReadySetGrow



Business Express: ReadySetGrow is a 10-session business development program. Each session lasts five hours. It gives business owners a clear perspective of the current status of their business, shows them critical ingredients for efficient and effective operations, and a road map for growth and a healthy bottom line. Business Express is powered by the U.S. Small Business Administration's CNPP, sponsored by Wells Fargo, and implemented by USPAACC.

This hybrid virtual/in-person program works in two tracks. Track 1 is designed for businesses in their early stages. It helps business owners to create an effective business plan, pricing strategy, marketing and promotional activities, and smart hiring policies. Track 2 caters to more mature and sophisticated businesses looking for procurement opportunities. It equips the business owner with knowledge, skills, and confidence, prepared to present their value proposition in-person, virtually, or in a group setting to existing or prospective customers. Fourteen cash college scholarships totaling \$54,000 awarded to high school seniors from across the country who have demonstrated academic excellence, community involvement, and financial need. The scholarships will help the students pursue their college dreams and prepare them for future leadership roles.

STRATEGIC AND MEDIA PARTNERS









USPAACC advocacy in 2023 focuses on six areas vital for the growth and success of Pan Asian American/AANHPI businesses and communities. In January 2023, USPAACC sent a <u>letter to President Biden</u> and Congressional leadership, advocating for these critical national bipartisan priorities.

Advancing **USPAACC**'s Agenda on Capitol Hill

The six key areas are:



Increasing Supplier Diversity

USPAACC urged the federal government to continue increasing its contracting opportunities for disadvantaged and underserved businesses, and promote supplier diversity nationwide. USPAACC CEO Susan Au Allen also wrote the op-ed, Expanding supplier diversity can be a unifying issue for the 118th Congress, published in The Hill.



Promoting Minority Business Certification

uspaacc highlighted the importance of disadvantaged and underserved business certification as a tool to access capital, contracts, and markets, as well as access to diverse talents and resources.



Providing Assistance for Minority Businesses and Communities

USPAACC expressed its support for the various relief programs and initiatives that have been implemented to help disadvantaged and undeserved businesses and communities recover from the COVID-19 pandemic.



Closing the Digital Divide, Addressing the Digital Skills Gap

USPAACC emphasized the need to bridge the digital divide and address the digital skills gap affecting a large number of disadvantaged and underserved businesses and communities. USPAACC proposed that the federal government invests more in broadband infrastructure, digital literacy, and workforce development, as well as promote innovation and entrepreneurship in these communities.



Standing up to Anti-Asian Hatred Crimes

USPAACC condemned the rise of anti-Asian hate crimes and incidents that have occurred since the pandemic arrived on our shores. USPAACC demanded that the federal government take swift and decisive action to combat this alarming trend, such as passing legislation, increasing law enforcement, and raising awareness.



Reauthorizing the U.S. Small Business Administration

USPAACC applauded the efforts of the U.S. Small Business Administration (SBA) in helping and providing resources to small businesses across the country to help them grow. USPAACC urged Congress to reauthorize the SBA, increases its budget and authority to enhance programs and services for disadvantaged businesses.

USPAACC once again demonstrated national leadership and bipartisan advocacy for Pan Asian American businesses and communities. USPAACC also reaffirmed its strong commitment to working with the federal government and other stakeholders to advance these priorities and create a more inclusive and prosperous society for all.
